AR-15 Clinics

These clinics have been designed to cover all aspects of High Power Rifle Competition.

All clinics will include an informative lecture on safety, handling and function of the AR-15.

Each clinic focuses on one of the four positions used in matches & are offered on the following dates:

Sunday, April 18th: 200 Yard Sitting Rapid Fire - #1

Saturday, May 29th: 200 Yard Standing Slow Fire - #2

Saturday, June 12th: 300 Yard Prone Rapid Fire - #3

Saturday, June 19th: 600 Yard Prone Slow Fire - #4

The cost for each clinic is \$65 for adults and \$55 for juniors or \$200 for the full series of four clinics - for both adults and juniors.

BCGC will furnish "National Match" grade AR-15s and ammo for all clinics.

If you wish, you may be instructed using your personal Service Rifle.

However, BCGC will only furnish ammo for rifles using .223 cartridges.

You'll be required to furnish your own ammo for any other cartridge.

Upon completion of this series, you'll be fully prepared to confidently enter any

NRA High Power Rifle competition. Also, completion of any of these clinics will satisfy the CMP requirements to purchase US surplus rifles and ammunition.

Each clinic will conclude with a potluck meal, so bring a favorite dish to share!

BCGC will provide brats & soft drinks. In order to secure a spot, pre-registration

is encouraged; call the clinic coordinator at least one week prior to the clinic date in which you're interested. Late entries will be accepted until 0715 on the day of the clinic if space is

available - the range capacity is limited to 44 shooters. No refunds will be granted after the date of the clinic you registered for. Anyone wishing a refund must notify the clinic coordinator

AR15 CLINIC INFO

OUTLINE & WHAT TO BRING

The Camp Fickes range is located in the Pike National Forest at 8500 ft elevation. It is a 600 yd range with target carriers in a pit protected from the firing lines by earth and concrete. There are 15 firing points with firing lines at 200, 300 and 600 yards. Primitive toilets are located at the target area, 300 yd and 600 yd lines. In addition to the rifle range, there is a 100 yd rifle/pistol range with free standing above ground target frames. There is no water or electricity. Cell phone signals are sparse to none.

What to bring: Adequate clothing to protect from cold, rain and sun. A coat, raingear, hat with brim or visor and neck protection (hooded sweatshirt or bandana for example). Water/drinks and snacks or light lunch. There are no lunch breaks and potluck lunch isn't until nearly 1500. Long sleeves, long legged trousers and closed footwear are recommended for protection from hot brass cases. Also: pen, pencil, paper/notebook, sunscreen and eye/hearing protection. Insects are rarely a nuisance.

Outline: School circle (classroom portion) 0800-0945 with a break. Feel free to bring a folding chair, coffee or hot chocolate for class. The available seating is picnic tables. Mornings are usually chilly. Class will cover safety, rifle terminology, handling, scoring and marksmanship. At approx. 1000, we will muster at the firing line. There are usually three relays. Relay 1 shoots first. Relay 2 sets up behind shooter to act as scorekeeper and safety official. Relay 3 goes to pits to mark targets. There will be pit changes as each relay completes their firing of approx. 50 shots. Firing should be completed at approx 1500-1600 at which time the pot-luck will begin.

If there are any squadding requests to be on the same firing point (FP) or relay with a friend, please advise upon arrival or before. We hope you have a great time.
